# College festival attracts crowds

A CENTURY and a half of Catholic Education in Queensland has boosted numbers at an annual Villanova College festival to record numbers. The Queensland Catholic Schools and Colleges Music Festival hosted by Villanova at Coorparoo is in its 19th year, but this year it will attract almost 10,000 performers. College spokesman Keith Druery said the 9983 performers was up on previous years by a significant margin, an increase he attributed to the 150-year celebrations. The festival from August 14-16 is an annual showcase of music education and draws people from as far away as Cairns. "We would expect in excess 11,000 audience members to go through on the weekend," he said.
